

**Directions**: Go outside and find a relatively flat leaf that interests you. Try your best to find a leaf that has freshly fallen, avoid any leaves that crumble in your hands, also avoid picking a leaf off of a tree – they need those leaves for nutrients! Begin the pressing process by wrapping the leaf in newspaper, then placing it between heavy books to dry and flatten. Depending on the leaf, it can take up to a couple weeks to flatten and dry. Record your observations here and glue your pressed leaf in the space provided.
